

Colonel Robert M. Carroll (Class 39-42)

Colonel Carroll enlisted in the Army on February 6, 1942 at the New Cumberland Army Depot. He attended the Field Artillery Officer Candidate School at Fort Sill, Oklahoma and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant on November 19, 1942.

After OCS he was assigned to the 8th Armored Division at Fort Knox, Kentucky and served during World War II in the European Theater of Operation from June 28, 1945 until February 8, 1946. He was separated from the Army at Indian Gap Military Reservation on April 26, 1946.

Colonel Carroll joined the Army Organized Reserve Corps in 1946 and continued his career in the Pennsylvania National Guard. He graduated from the Command and General Staff College in 1961. His various assignments and duty positions included Operations Officer 28th Division; Personnel Officer (G-1) 28th Division; Chief of Staff, 28th Division and Assistant Chief of Staff Operations and Training, Pennsylvania Army National Guard. He was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel on March 29, 1960 and to Colonel on November 1, 1968. He retired in January 1977. His decorations include the Legion of Merit.
