Colonel David A. Feyrer (Class 5-64)

Colonel Feyrer graduated from Muhlenberg College, Pennsylvania in 1963 and then joined the Army. He graduated from the Artillery Officer Candidate School at Fort Sill, Oklahoma on April 28, 1964 and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant. He served on active duty for three years at Fort Sill and in Korea. During his tour in Korea, he commanded a Sergeant Missile Artillery Battery. He left active duty and served several years in the Individual Ready Reserve (IRR).

He attended Philadelphia Divinity School and graduated on May 16, 1969. Following seminary and ordination he returned to duty as an Army Reserve Chaplain.
