

Colonel Lawrence P. Mac Queen (Class 9-42)

Colonel Mac Queen earned a BS degree from the University of Pittsburg in 1938. He enlisted in the 107th Field Artillery Battalion of the Pennsylvania National Guard on October 14, 1940 and rose to the rank of Sergeant. He was called to active duty on February 17, 1941 and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant upon graduation from the Field Artillery Officer Candidate School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma on April 22, 1942.

He was promoted to Captain on April 8, 1943 and served during World War II in the European Theater of Operation from January 17 until December 4, 1945. He returned to Indian Gap Military Reservation, Pennsylvania and was separated from the Army on February 18, 1946.

Colonel Mac Queen rejoined the Army in July 1946 and returned to active duty. He attended the Army Strategic Intelligence School in 1949 and was promoted to Major on December 27, 1950 while serving with 5th Field Artillery Group at Fort Sill.

He earned an MBA degree from Syracuse University in 1955, completed the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas in 1956 and was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel on May 13, 1958. He graduated from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces at Fort McNair in 1963. He was promoted to Colonel on June 10, 1965.
