

Colonel Frederick G. Mehlman (Class 26-42)

Colonel Mehlman attended St. Johnsbury Academy, the Universities of Vermont and Illinois and graduated from Boston University Law School in 1941. He enlisted in the Army on January 29, 1942 and rose to the rank of Corporal.

He entered the Field Artillery Officer Candidate School on May 28, 1942 and was commissioned on August 17th. He served during World War II and was released from active duty in 1946. He joined the Vermont Army National Guard as a Staff Specialist and rose through the ranks as a JAG Corps officer. He was promoted to Colonel in 1965 and retired in 1974.

Colonel Mehlman practiced law in St. Johnsbury, Vermont and then in Montpelier, Vermont, where he was General Counsel for National Life Insurance Company. He served in various Part Time Vermont State positions including Deputy Attorney General, member and Chairman of the Vermont Water Resources Board, The Vermont Statutory Revision Commission, Public Defender and Legislative Draftsman. He died on April 30, 2003.
