

Major General Harley L. Pickens (Class 5-51)

Major General Pickens graduated with a degree in industrial engineering from Lehigh University Class of 1950. After entering the Army, he graduated from the Artillery Officer Candidate School at Fort Sill, Oklahoma on November 20, 1951 and served in the Korean War.

He continued active-duty service with an anti-aircraft artillery unit for three years and then joined the Army Reserves. His reserve assignments included duty as Assistant Plans and Training Officer of the 157th Infantry Brigade in 1964 when he was subsequently promoted to Major.

He attended the Army War College in 1981 as a Colonel and after years of distinguished service he was promoted to Major General and commanded the Army Reserve 78th Division. He retired in 1985 and died on October 30, 2010.
