

Colonel Nolan M. Sigler (Class 50-54)

Colonel Sigler enlisted in the Army on April 20, 1953. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant upon graduation from the Artillery Officer Candidate School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma on April 6, 1954.

He was promoted to Major on April 23, 1965 and to Lieutenant Colonel on May 31, 1968.

His service included tours in Vietnam, Panama and Uruguay. He was promoted to Colonel on September 3, 1974 and was exercise director of the joint Field Artillery firing exercise (Firex 76) at Fort Bragg in 1976 while he was in command of the XVIII Corps Division Artillery.

He was trained at the Benjamin Franklin Berlitz School of Language in preparation for duties with the State Department concerning international security affairs pertaining to Africa in 1974.

He served as Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans at U.S. Western Command (U.S. Army, Pacific) at Fort Shafter, Hawaii.

Colonel Sigler's awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Bronze Star, and the Air Medal with nine Oak Leaf Clusters.
