Heritage Hall Traffic:

This year's Attendance figures lead us to expect more than 28,000 visitors to the Field Artillery Museum in 2024. Nearly 25% of the visitors are soldiers (as part of the history lessons during AIT, BOLC and Captains Career Course). Many parents and families attending Basic and AIT graduations visit the Museum with their Soldiers. One way or another, more than 100 individuals are exposed to the OCS story every day the Museum is open.

Nearly every time Penny and I are in the classroom, we encounter visitors. We usually hear them coming from the museum and down the hallway lined with all the pictures. Many are genuinely fascinated by our unscripted presentations. We have piqued the interest of some enlisted college graduates and a few others almost to that point who have never really thought about becoming commissioned officers.

We are creating a trifold handout for visitors to the Artillery OCS Heritage Hall. The handout will contain links to the Artillery OCS website and an Army web page with information on the different paths available for becoming a U.S. Army Officer. Additionally, we plan to include an information panel on the wall that will function as a recruiting tool. We got this idea after a discussion with COL Jerry Bijold, Class 8-66 a few months ago.

The current Garrison Commander joined the Army in 1997 as a research technician and was selected for Officer Candidate School in June 2000. His journey serves as an excellent example of what can be achieved.
