## Lt. John Badura, 26, Killed in Germany

Missing in action over Germany since Jan. 26, 1945, First Lt. John Badura, 26, of 145 Merrimac St., is



now reported killed on that date by German machinegun fire over the Rohr River.

Liaison pilo with the 360th Artillery Field Battalion, Lieu-tenant Badura was a graduate of East Evening High School and had been em-ployed by H. B

Graves Company BADURA before he entered the College of Forestry at Syracuse University After a year of college, he enlisted in the Air Corps and was sensoverseas in February, 1943. He held the Air Medal.

He is survived by his mother his wife, Mrs. Connie Douglas Badura of Lawton, Okla.; four brothers, Peter, recently discharged from the Army; Stanley and Ed ward of Rochester and Joseph o Elmira, and five sisters, Mrs. Stan ley Nazzimek, Mrs. Stanley Mack Mrs. Harold Cramer, Mrs. Arthur Stoll Jr. and Miss Frances Badura all of Rochester. A memorial mass will be held Sunday, Qct. 14, at 8 a. m. in St. Theresa's Church.
