Missing in action over Germany since Jan. 26, 1945, First Lt. John Badura, 26, of 145 Merrimac St., is now reported killed on that date by German machinegun fire over the Rohn River.

Liaison pilot with the 360th Field Artillery Battalion, Lieutenant Badura was a graduate of East Evening High School and had been employed by H. B. Graves Company before he entered the College of Forestry at Syracuse University. After a year of college, he enlisted in the Air Corps and was sent overseas in February, 1943. He held the Air Medal.

He is survived by his mother, his wife, Mrs. Connie Douglas Badura of Lawton, Okla.; four brothers, Peter, recently discharged from the Army; Stanley and Edward of Rochester and Joseph of Elmira, and five sisters, Mrs. Stanley Nazzimek, Mrs. Stanley Mack, Mrs. Harold Cramer, Mrs. Arthur Stoll Jr. and Miss Frances Badura, all of Rochester. A memorial mass will be held Sunday, Oct. 14, at 8 a. m. in St. Theresa's Church.
