

Major General Kennedy C. Bullard (Class 2-41)

Major General Bullard entered military service with the Florida National Guard on 7 June 1939 as a Private in Tampa, Florida. Inducted into active Federal service 25 November 1940. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant on 12 November 1941 upon graduation from Officer Candidate School (Class #2) Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

General Bullard's assignments included Training Officer, 2nd Regiment Field Artillery Replacement Center, Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He served overseas in Africa and Italy. He was Executive Officer and Battery Commander, Battery B, 91st Armored Field Artillery Battalion, 1st Armored Division, Assistant Plans and Training Officer, 91st Armored Artillery Battalion, 1st Armored Division. He was released from active duty on 7 December 1945.

His Reserve assignments commencing 11 April 1947 included Commander, Battery B, 116th Field Artillery Battalion; Plans and Training Officer, Executive Officer and Battalion Commander, 116th Field Artillery Battalion; Executive Officer, 163rd Artillery Group; Artillery Officer and G-4, 55th Operational Headquarters Divisional; and Commander, 163rd Artillery Group.

In 1967 he became Deputy Commander, 53rd Armored Brigade and was Commander, 53rd Infantry Brigade (Separate) until appointed Adjutant General of the State of Florida on August 13, 1975. He served in that position until Dec. 31, 1981.

General Bullard's military decorations include the Bronze Star with V Device and the Purple Heart.
