CPT Castro was the pilot of a UH-1H helicopter from the 192nd Assault Helicopter Company that crashed in bad weather in Zuc Me Pass near Da Lat. The seven men on board were missing in action until the wreckage was found almost three years later. The wreckage was located on 9 July 1973, and the recovered remains were identified on 5 Sep 1973. Captain Castro is buried in Rose Hills Memorial Park Cemetery (Garden of Benediction), Los Angeles, California.
