General Mike P. Cokinos, Silver Star and Purple Heart holder, is the Deputy Commanding General of the 90th Army Reserve Command (ARCOM).

After graduating from Texas A. & M. College in 1943, with a B.S. Degree in Science, he entered active Military Service at Ft. Sill, Oklahoma.

His first assignment was with the 8th Armored Division as a Forward Observer with the 7th Infantry Bn. during the Battle of the Bulge in Germany. General Cokinos participated in the following major engagements - Ardennes, Rhineland and Central Europe. On occupation duty in Austria, he commanded the Hq. Btry. of the 324th Bn., 83rd Division.
