Mr. Dunham served as a TAC officer in the Officer Candidate Brigade prior to attending the Political Warfare Advisor Course at the John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center, Fort Bragg. He served a tour in Vietnam with the 24th Special Tactical Zone as an Artillery Advisor with the Vietnamese 42nd Infantry Regiment and later G-3 Air Operations Advisor, Liaison Officer and Aerial Observer with the ARVN 22nd Infantry Division. Returning to Fort Sill he commanded Headquarters Battery 4th Battalion, 4th Field Artillery and served as AS-3/ Battalion Fire Direction Officer, 1st Battalion, 18th Field Artillery. He later commanded the 557th Artillery Group (SASCOM) Headquarters Detachment in Germany.

Since retiring from the U.S. Postal Service in 2005, he has served as curator of the Artillery OCS Hall of Fame and has conducted extensive research into the history of the Army OCS programs and the contributions of its graduates to the nation and the military. He recently published *The OCS Experience (Memories of Robinson Barracks Artillery Officer Candidate school 1941-1973)*. His tireless efforts on behalf of the graduates of this institution have been instrumental in bringing new life and vigor to the legacy of the school and increased awareness in the military community.

He and his wife Penny plan and coordinate the annual FAOCS Alumni Chapter reunions at Fort Sill and volunteer their services at the General Tommy Franks Leadership Institute and Museum. They also continue to serve in leadership positions in several veteran's organizations in the Lawton/Fort Sill Community.

Mr. Dunham's decorations include the Bronze Star Medal and Army Commendation Medal.
