

COLONEL ROGER L. DUNLAP CLASS 2-57

Colonel Dunlap's initial assignment was with the 301st USA Security Agency (USASA) Battalion in Korea, followed by command and staff assignments of increasing responsibility with other ASA units at Fort Bragg and the United Kingdom.

After attending the ASA Career Course, he served with the 37th USASA Liaison Detachment at Fort Monroe, Virginia and then as Troop Commander with the 409th ASA Detachment at Fort Meade as they prepared to deploy to Vietnam with the 11th Armored Cavalry. He was later assigned to the 509th Radio Research Group attached to MACV (J2), where he served as Tactical/Strategic Cryptographic Officer in the Current Intelligence Indications Branch.

After attending Command and General Staff College he joined the faculty of the General Staff Section of the Department of Command. He later served as USASA Field Station Commander and Deputy Chief of Staff Army-Air Force Joint Operations Group, Shemya US Air Force Base, Alaska. Subsequent assignments included G2 of the 2nd Armored Division located at Fort Hood, Texas and Inspections Team Chief, Office of The U.S. Army Inspector General Agency, HQDA, Inspections and Surveys Division. He culminated his career as President/Commander, United States Army Intelligence and Security Board (USAISBD), located at Fort Huachuca, Arizona.

Colonel Dunlap's decorations include the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal with Oak-Leaf Cluster, the Joint Services Commendation Medal and the Army Commendation Medal with Oak-Leaf Cluster.
