He was serving with the 175th Assault Helicopter Company, 1st Aviation Brigade as the pilot of an AH-1G Cobra that was shot down during a night-time gun run. Prior to his time with the 175th AHC, he had been assigned to the 114th Aviation Company.

We served together in 5th Corps in Aschaffenburg Germany between our first and second tours in Vietnam. Neither of us wanted to go back to Vietnam, but we both responded to the call of our Country when it came. You are a fine human being, a great friend, soldier, and husband to your wife Gabby. You were always the professional in everything you did in life ... whatever you did, you did very well. Everyone who knew you respected you for who you are. We all knew that you did not want to go back to Vietnam in Cobra gunships, but you went because you were called to do so. I have shed many tears for you Chuck, and for Gabby, who lost her husband and best friend. I visited you at the Wall and have prayed for you and your family numerous times, and will continue to do so. I don't understand why such a fine man as you was taken so early... only God knows the answer to that question. After 35 years, I still have an aching heart and the tears flow freely, as I write these words to you. Be at peace brother, and know that you are missed and dearly loved.
