Commander, Headquarters Augmentation Tennessee Army National Guard General Ellison started his military career as an enlisted man in the Arkansas National Guard on 21 February 1938. On 6 January 1941, he was ordered to active duty with his unit. On 8 October 1942, he graduated from the Artillery Officers Candidate School and was commissioned a second lieutenant. He served as Motor Officer, Reconnaissance and Survey Officer, Battery Executive Officer, and Battery Commander in various units in the United States. In April 1945, he was transferred to the Southwest Pacific as a Battery Commander in the 797th Field Artillery Battalion. During the period December 1945 to January 1947, he was assigned to the Infantry School, Fort Benning, Georgia. In January 1947, he was assigned to Korea as Assistant S-3 of the 37th Field Artillery Battalion. He was released from active duty in the grade of captain on 17 September 1947, and retained his commission in the Organized Reserve Corps.

General Ellison joined the Tennessee Army National Guard in September 1949 as a captain in the 178th Armored Cavalry Regiment. He was promoted to major on 22 January 1951 and served as S-3 and then as Executive Officer of Headquarters, 3rd Battalion, 173rd Armor Cavalry Regiment. He served in this capacity until 28 October 1954 when the unit was redesignated to the 280th Armored Reconnaissance Battalion and he was assigned as the Battalion Commander.

He received his promotion to lieutenant colonel on 2 February 1955, and to colonel on 7 December 1960, with assignment as Commanding Officer, 2nd Brigade, 30th Armored Division. On 28 April 1966, he was assigned as Assistant Division Commander, Headquarters, 30th Armored Division, and Federally recognized as brigadier general of the Line on that same date. Upon reorganization of the Tennessee Army National Guard on 1 February 1968, General Ellison was reassigned as Commander of the State Headquarters Augmentation.
