General Remarks:

Colonel Evans was commissioned by the US Army Field Artillery OCS at Ft Sill on March 6, 1970. Immediately after commissioning, he was involuntarily designated to go Signal as was about 50% of the 6th Class of 1970. Although Signal, his first assignment was to an FA unit in the 82nd Airborne Division, where he was able to hone both Signal and Field Artillery skills—to the point that his FA Battalion Commander, LTC Diermeyer, ordered him to put in a Regular Army Commission application packet. He was approved for Regular Army Commission about a year later.

Command is Colonel Evans forte. He has had two company commands. One in Vietnam and one at Ft Hood; both while he was a lieutenant. He was also selected to command two battalions—a US Army recruiting battalion in Peoria, Illinois and the 6th Signal Battalion in the 6th Infantry Division, Alaska. He now commands the Garrison at Ft Leavenworth Kansas.

Among his more recent achievements has been the complete restructuring of the Signal Corps force to meet the needs of the Twenty First Century Army. Under his tenure as Signal Proponent Chief, Signal MOSs have gone from 38 to 18 by eliminating obsolete skills, and matching current training requirements to emerging technologies. As the Director of US Army Signal Training, he set the curriculum and training standards for 47,000 signal soldiers over a 48 month period. The writing of 14 revised doctrinal manuals aligned Signal Doctrine with the new force projection doctrine of the US Army.

Although his garrison command tour has just started, his installation has already been recognized by the Army Communities of Excellence Committee as the second best installation in the US Army, and the image of Ft Leavenworth being the "best hometown in the Army," is constantly being enhanced.
