Colonel William H. Fleshman (Class 52-43)

Colonel Fleshman was born Sept. 26, 1921, in Leavenworth, Kansas and graduated from Leavenworth High School. He holds a bachelor's degree from Cameron University, where he was an adjunct instructor from 1979-83.

He was inducted into the U.S. Army at Fort Sill in 1942 and graduated from the Field Artillery Officer Candidate School as a second lieutenant on February 18, 1943. He served in World War II, Korea and Vietnam, and his last assignment was as Deputy Assistant Commandant of the Army Field Artillery School at Fort Sill.
