He worked with the California Highway Patrol to organize the Community Traffic Task Force and was Chairman of the Oakland Maritime Day Port of Oakland in 1996. He served multiple terms on the Castro Valley Municipal Advisory Council. He started the Neighborhood Watch Committee for the community and developed a Disaster Preparedness Committee which has a Net (Neighborhood Emergency Team) with over 130 members, the largest in the Bay area. He worked tirelessly with various agencies to mitigate the inherent problems associated with a large constituency.
