

The War Department informed Mrs. Louise Grell, 220 Forster street, late yesterday that her husband, Second Lieutenant Robert Grell, had died on June 24 as a result of wounds received in action in France on June 22.

Lt. Grell has been overseas with the Field Artillery as a Reconnaissance Officer since March, and is believed to have participated in the invasion of Normandy.

A former member of the National Guard, he entered the Army in January, 1941, and trained at Camp Shelby, Miss., before attending Officers Candidate School, at Fort Sill, where he was commissioned. He is the son of George Grell, 412 Herr street, and is a graduate of the Hershey Industrial School. He was employed at the Glenn Martin Co., in Baltimore, Md.

Never Saw Baby Son
Lt. Grell never saw his thremonths-old son, Robert Eugene,

Grell left the country.
