2LT Greshamer was killed in action during his first month in Vietnam. He was serving with Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 6th Battalion, 29th Artillery, 4th Infantry Division.

His last mission

I was a Forward Observer also attached to the 1st Battalion 8th Inf. and I met Lt. Greshamer in the field the day before he was killed. I was asked by an officer in the Fire Direction Center to give Leon some pointers since he was new to the field and I had been in the field several months. I met with Leon for a few hours in the afternoon on the day he arrived in the field and told him how I performed my tasks and how I supported the infantry company commander to which I was attached. The next day the two companies he and I were assigned to moved out on patrol near Dak To. His company moved out first and he was killed, I believe by a sniper. I have always wondered if I had not given him an adequate briefing. This action occurred a week or so after TET and shortly after my Company was attacked by North Vietnamese infantry while we were set up in a perimeter formation. I was saddened by his loss.
