

Major General Henry Melvin Hagwood - Artillery OCS Class 3-60

Major General Hagwood was born on October 27, 1937 in San Antonio, Texas, United States.

He served as commander 1st Battalion 20th Field Artillery, 4th Infantry Division, Fort Carson, Colorado, 1977-1979; chief program and budget branch plans and operations division, Test & Evaluation Agency, Falls Church, Virginia, 1980-1981; comptroller, Army National Guard, National Guard Bureau, Washington, 1981-1982; commander, Field Artillery Training Center, Fort Sill, Oklahoma, 1982-1984; chief of staff, Field Artillery Center and Fort Sill, Fort Sill, Oklahoma, 1984-1985; deputy chief of staff for resource management, Forces Command, Fort McPherson, Georgia, 1985-1989; deputy chief of staff for resource management, Training and Doctrine Command, Fort Monroe, Virginia, 1989-1994; retired, 1994.

He earned a Bachelor of Science, University of Nebraska, 1969; Master of Public Administration, Shippensburg State College, 1980; postgraduate, Harvard University John F. Kennedy School Government, 1990.

General Hagwood's decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit with 2 oak leaf clusters, Bronze Star with oak leaf clusters, the Air Medal and the Army Commendation medal.
