COLONEL NORMAN R. HALEY DEPUTY COMMANDER 32D ARMY AIR DEFENSE COMMAND

Colonel Norman R. Haley, Deputy Commander, 32d Army Air Defense Command, was born in Hatfield, Missouri on 13 June 1921. He attended Northwest Missouri State College in Maryville, Missouri, and later completed the requirements for a Bachelor of Science Degree at the University of Maryland.

Entering the military service in 1940, Colonel Haley graduated from the Artillery Officer Candidate School in December 1942 and was integrated into the Regular Army in 1946.

During World War II, Colonel Haley served overseas with the 693d Field Artillery Battalion and participated in five major campaigns in Central Europe. For this service he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster and V-Device, the Purple Heart, and the French Croix De Guerre with Silver Star. From the end of World War II until 1949, Colonel Haley served in various assignments at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and overseas in Germany and Italy. In 1949 he returned to Fort Sill to attend the Artillery Officers Advanced Course and subsequent assignment as an instructor with the Maryland National Guard.

In January 1953, Colonel Haley reported to Headquarters I Corps in Korea and was assigned duties as Assistant G-2. While in Korea he participated in three major campaigns and was awarded the Second Oak Leaf Cluster to the Bronze Star Medal. He was also awarded the Republic of Korea Presidential Citation.

Returning to the United States in March of 1954, Colonel Haley initially served as S-3 and Executive Officer of the 10th AAA Battalion (Skysweeper) at Fairchild AFB, Washington, and then reported to Fort Leavenworth, Kansas where he attended the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College. Subsequent to the course at Fort Leavenworth, Colonel Haley served in staff positions at Headquarters First U.S. Army and the Department of the Army.

In 1961, Colonel Haley attended the Armed Forces Staff College at Norfolk, Virginia and immediately thereafter traveled to Paris, France where he attended the NATO Defense College. After Graduating from the NATO Defense College in February 1962, he reported to Headquarters Allied Land Forces Southeastern Europe at Izmir, Turkey where he served as Chief of G-3 Operations. Upon completion of this tour of duty Colonel Haley was awarded the Army Commendation Medal.

Returning to the United States in August 1964, Colonel Haley attended the Nike Hercules Familiarization Course at Fort Bliss, Texas, and then assumed command of the 4th Battalion (Hercules), 562d Artillery, a part of the Dallas-Fort Worth Defense. Upon completion of that assignment he attended the Army War College, Class of 1966, and then became Executive Officer of the 52d Artillery Brigade (Air Defense) at Fort Hancock, New Jersey. He was awarded the Legion of Merit for his service with the 52d Artillery Brigade.

Colonel Haley became Deputy Commander of the 32d Army Air Defense Command in January 1968.
