HONORED—Captain Rollin F. Harlow, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Harlow, 1915 Alta Vista Drive, who gave his life fighting on Okinawa, has been posthumously awarded the Silver Star Medal for gallantry in action. Captain Harlow was a battery commander in the Three Hundred Sixty-first Field Artillery Battalion. He was a former partner of George Crome of the Bakersfield Hardware Company.
