His tenacity, leadership, and devotion to duty made a significant impact on the lives of the South Vietnamese officers and soldiers who worked with his team as well as on the Montagnards and Vietnamese living in the villages and hamlets in his area of operations. America lost an outstanding leader and brave soul on December 6, 1970.
