GENERAL REMARKS: In his current position as Commander, U.S. Army Central Identification Laboratory, Hawaii (USACILHI), Colonel Jordan oversees the mission of recovery and forensic identification of servicemen missing from all conflicts and theaters of war. The USACILHI, a PERSCOM Organization, is the operational arm of the U.S. Army in the Army's role as executive agent for this mission for all services.

This unique 141 soldier/29 civilian organization, routinely performs these dangerous and sensitive missions in Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, Europe, South Pacific, and other localities where U.S. servicemen were lost. The organization has recovered and identified 563 U.S. personnel from such diverse locations as Tibet (a successful WWII mission COL Jordan led), Brazil and Papua New Guinea.
