

COLONEL PAUL E. JUNK CLASS 33-53

Colonel Junk enlisted in the Army in 1951 and attended Counter Intelligence School at Fort Holabird, Maryland prior to attending OCS. After graduation he was assigned as a Criminal Investigation Command (CIC) Investigator with the 5th US Army CIC Field Office, Omaha Nebraska. He then served as a Courier with the 441 Counter Intelligence Command Detachment in Tokyo, Japan.

Subsequent assignments included Public Safety Officer, USAR 308th Civil Affairs Group, Executive Officer, 424th Military Censorship Group, Economics Officer with the 420th Civil Affairs Company and the 307th Civil Affairs Group. After Command and General Staff College he became an Instructor at the USAR C&GSC. He also served as Guest Lecturer, International Trade and Finance at the C&GSC at Fort Leavenworth. He later served in a Mobilization Designee (MOBDES) assignment as Director of Security at Fort Riley, Kansas.

Colonel Junk has a PHD in Economics and Finance from Northwestern University and is currently Professor Emeritus, Economics and Finance, University of Minnesota, Duluth. He has served as an Economist with the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, Chairman of the Department of Economics, University of Missouri, Dean of the School of Business, Washburn University and Vice Chancellor Academic Administration, University of Minnesota, Duluth.

Colonel Junk's Awards include the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, the Army Commendation Medal and the Meritorious Service Medal.
