Colonel Milton J. Kinne, Jr. (Class 41-53)

Colonel Kinne was born May 22, 1932 in Webb City, Missouri. He was a military child and lived in many different places. He graduated high school from the Tokyo American High School Meguro in Tokyo, Japan. He later earned his bachelor's degree in business management from Cameron University.

He enlisted in the U.S. Army in August of 1952 and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant upon graduation from the Artillery Officer Candidate School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma on October 6, 1953.
