## Colonel Edward Norman Krause (Class 61-43)

Colonel Krause was drafted from Berlin, Wisconsin on August 26, 1942 and took basic training at Fort Sill, Oklahoma in the "Pack Artillery." He later attended Field Artillery school at Fort Sill and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant on April 23, 1943.

His first assignment was with the 31st Division, 114th Field Artillery Battalion and served in various capacities from assistant executive officer to S-4 with the battalion. He served with the 31st Division in the South Pacific from June 1944 to October 1945.

He was later assigned to the 63rd Field Artillery battalion, 24th Infantry Division in Mindanao, Philippines, and occupation duty in Japan. After returning to the United States in February 1946, he was discharged on April 22, 1946 at Camp McCoy and became a member of the U.S. Army Reserve upon discharge.

As a member of the U.S. Army Reserve, Colonel Krause has served with the 432nd Military Government unit in Beaver Dam and Fond du Lac. He also attended the 5045th United States Army Reserve School in Madison in military intelligence and engineering courses.

His other school and duty assignments as a reservist have been: Graduated from the Infantry Officers Career Course, Fort Benning, GA, 1961; instructed in the Infantry Officer Career Course in 1962 at Fond du Lac, a satellite school of Madison; graduated from the Command and General Staff School in 1967, Fort Leavenworth, KS; instructed in the Command and General Staff Course 1968-69, at Madison; and graduated from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, Madison, 1971.

His decorations during World War II include the Silver Star for gallantry in action in Mindanao in 1945.
