



MAJOR GENERAL GEORGE M. KRAUSZ

Major General Krausz's first assignment after OCS was with an Honest John Missile Battery at Fort. Carson, CO. He then attended the Army Language School, studied Polish and had several assignments in Germany before attending the FA Advanced Course.

His first assignment in Viet Nam with the First Cavalry Division saw service as an assistant S3 and Battery Commander in the 2nd Battalion, 19th Field Artillery. After attending the US Army Command and General Staff College, he returned to the First Cavalry Division as the Battalion Executive Officer and later as the Battalion Commander, 1st Battalion, 77th Field Artillery. Returning to Fort Sill, Major General Krausz served in the Gunnery Department, and then took command of the 1st Battalion, 17th Field Artillery.

A tour in the Pentagon in the Office of the Chief of Staff was followed by the Army War College and a return to Fort Sill to command the 75th Field Artillery Group and then serve as the Director of Training Developments in the Field Artillery School. After serving as Chief of Staff at Fort Dix, NJ, Major General Krausz went back to the Pentagon as Deputy Director for Operations, J3, JCS and then returned to Germany, this time as Assistant Division Commander, Support, 3rd Infantry Division. Returning again to TRADOC, he served as the Director of Combat Developments at TRADOC Headquarters and in June 1987 he assumed command of Fort Jackson, SC, where in January 1989 Fort Jackson was designated as the Army's Community of Excellence.

Major General Krausz's decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star Medal (with three Oak-Leaf Clusters), and the Meritorious Service Medal (with Oak-Leaf Cluster).
