He was the pilot of a single engine 0-1 Bird Dog on a visual reconnaissance mission with an ARVN observer, when he was fatally wounded by a sniper. The observer managed to get the aircraft back to Soc Trang Army Airfield but crashed attempting to land. The aircraft was destroyed.
