<u>MAJOR ASSIGNMENTS AND REMARKS</u>	
As XO of 301st Trans Det (TR) in 1967 I was project Officer for Port Surveys of Port Everglades in Fort Lauderdale FL as well as the New Port of Miami in Miami Florida. This was to assess the thru-put capacity of the port during the Cuban crisis. As Port Survey Officer in 1968 I was project Officer for the Port of New York in assessing the ship containerization capabilities insupplying overseas deployments.	
Both these assignments were conducted at the request of the US Army Eastern Area Military Traffic and Management Service in Brooklyn NY.	
As CO of the 323rd Medical Lab in 1969 I started on the job training for our laboratory technicians at seven major Boston Hospitals where we worked side by side with civilian technicians every weekend of the month. Being an Army level Laboratory with 125 personel there is no one laboratory large enough to give the type of training needed.
