Colonel Larned completed Airborne training and Ranger School prior to attending Officer Candidate School. He was the Honor graduate of his OCS class. His first assignment after graduation was to the XVIII Airborne Corps at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He served four years and seven months in command of Infantry units and his time in the military included ten years, six months of foreign service.
