On April 13, 1969, CPT Ledford was the pilot of an AH-1G Cobra helicopter making an attack run on an enemy gun position in Quang Nam Province. While at an approximate altitude of 500 feet and in a 45 degree dive, an accompanying aircraft pilot saw the Cobra hit by hostile ground fire. He also described seeing the pilot's compartment separate from the aircraft and disintegrate as it fell. Both crewmen were initially reported missing in action. CPT Ledford's remains were recovered on April 20, 1969. The other crew member, CW3 William C. Pierson was declared dead/body not recovered. He was serving with Troop D, 2nd Battalion, 17th Cavalry, 101st Airborne Division at the time of his death.

He also described seeing the pilot's compartment separate from the aircraft and disintegrate as it fell. Both crewmen were initially reported missing in action. Captain Ledford's remains were recovered on April 20, 1969. Warrant Officer Pierson was declared dead/body not recovered, in October 1978. U.S. POWs returned alive during Operation Homecoming were unable to provide any information on the fate of Warrant Officer Pierson.
