## Lt. C. L. Mardin Killed in Plane Crash

First Lt. Clayton L. Mardin, USA, was killed in a plane crash at Oahu, Hawaii, May 4, according to an official telegram received by his wife, Mrs. Hazel (Campbell) Mardin of 44 Lawrence street, Portsmouth, yesterday.

Lieutenant Mardin, who had 1,000 flying hours to his credit, was training army observers at the time of the accident. He was serving as a liaison pilot.

He entered the service April, 1942, and was graduated from officers candidate school at Fort Sill, Okla., in June, 1943. He had been stationed at Camp Rucker, Ala., before going to Hawaii about a year ago.

Lieutenant Mardin, the son of Mr. and Mrs. S. Eugene Mardin of Lisbon, was graduated from Lisbon high school in 1938 and attended Keene Teachers college.
