

Colonel Paul Earl McIntyre (Class 65-43)

Colonel McIntyre was commissioned a Second Lieutenant upon graduation from the Field Artillery Officer Candidate School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma on May 19, 1943.

His initial assignment was to the 14th Armored Division at Camp Chaffee, Arkansas (Pending activation of the 16th Armored Division).

During World War II he served as a Forward Observer with the 397th Field Artillery, 16th Armored Division and Commanded Headquarters Battery.

He later served as a Liaison Officer to the 33rd Field Artillery, 1st Infantry Division.

His career in the Army Reserve with the 434th Field Artillery Group included time as the Group S-4.

He graduated from the Command and General Staff College and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces.

He was promoted to Colonel on March 31, 1969 and was inducted into the Artillery OCS Hall of Fame at Fort Sill by the Assistant Commandant of the Field Artillery School, BG Robert J. Koch on April 26, 1973.
