BIOGRAPHY MAJOR GENERAL FRANK L. MILLER, JR. DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS, J3 FORCES COMMAND FORT MCPHERSON, GEORGIA 30330-6000

Major General Miller was born in Atchison, Kansas on 27 January 1944 to MSG(Ret) Frank L. Miller. He entered the Army in 1965 as a Private and attended the Field Artillery Officer Candidate School immediately after basic training. He was commissioned on 13 September 1966 and assigned to Fort Lewis, Washington, as a Basic Training Company Training Officer. General Miller served in the Republic of South Vietnam from 1967 to 1968. Upon his return from Vietnam he married the former Paulette C. Duncan of Tacoma, Washington. The Millers have three children: Frank III, Michael, and Toni.

After their marriage, the Millers were assigned to Fort Sill, Oklahoma, to attend the Field Artillery Officer Advanced Course. Upon graduation, General Miller returned to Fort Lewis and was assigned to the 212th Field Artillery Group where he commanded A Battery, 2d Battalion, 34th Field Artillery. From Fort Lewis, he served a tour in the Republic of South Korea, where he was assigned to staff positions at battalion and division level. Returning from Korea in 1971, General Miller attended the University of Washington, in Seattle, where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. From the University of Washington, he was assigned to the 1st Infantry Division at Fort Riley, Kansas. While in the First Division Artillery, General Miller commanded his second battery, served as a battalion S-3, participated in four REFORGER Exercises, and was promoted to major.

General Miller's next assignment sent him to Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, to attend the Command and General Staff College. He graduated with distinction and was then sent to Mildenhall, England, to serve aboard the USCINCEUR Airborne Command Post as a battle staff team operations officer. While in England, he completed his Master's Degree in Systems Management from Troy State University. Returning to the United States in July 1980, General Miller was promoted to lieutenant colonel and selected to command the 1st Battalion, 35th Field Artillery at Fort Stewart, Georgia. After thirty months of command, he was selected for promotion to colonel and attended the Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island, where he graduated with distinction in June 1984.

General Miller served as the Chief of Staff of the United States Army's National Training Center, Ft Irwin, California, from July 1984 to July 1986. In August 1986, he and his family were reassigned to Athens, Greece, where he assumed command of the 558th United States Army Artillery Group. The Millers returned from Greece in August 1988 and General Miller was assigned to Fort Sill, Oklahoma, as the Chief of Staff.

In June 1989, he assumed command of the III Corps Artillery until May 1992. General Miller assumed duties as the Director of Operations, J3, Forces Command, Fort McPherson, Georgia, on 10 June 1992.

General Miller's decorations and awards include the Legion of Merit with OLC, the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Bronze Star Medal with "V" device and 2 Oak Leaf Clusters, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Medal with "V" device and 19 Oak Leaf Clusters, the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters, the State of Georgia Meritorious Service Medal, and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star.
