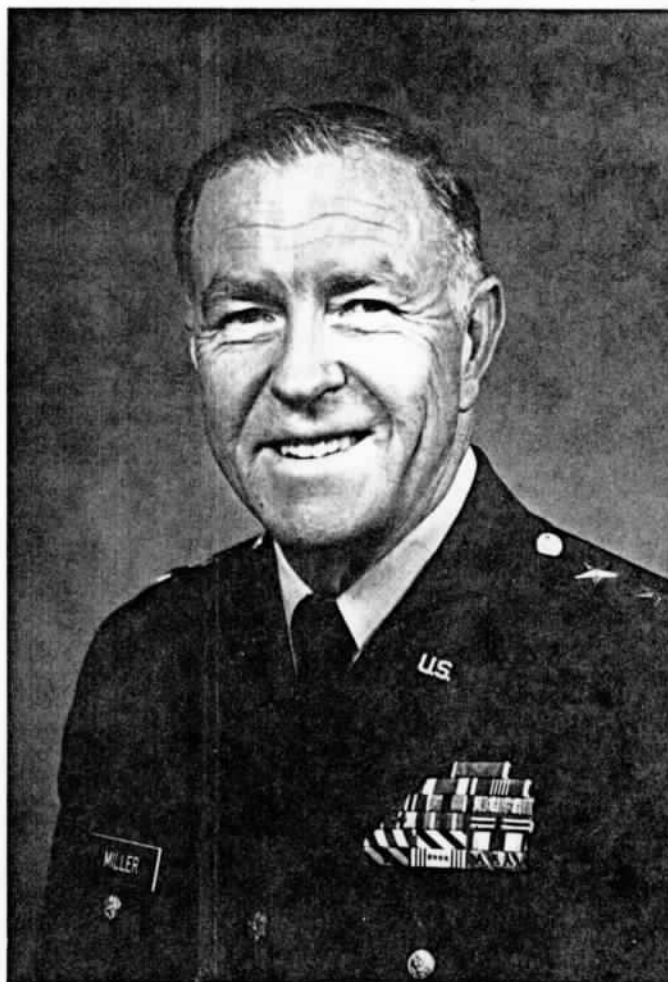

Narrative Summary:

Born: Cedar City, Utah, 23 April 1938

SCHOOLS: Elementary Education, BS, College of Southern Utah (Branch of Utah State University) 1959; Field Artillery Officer Basic Course, 1960; Field Artillery Survey Course, 1964; Associate Field Artillery Officer Career Course, 1965; Nuclear Weapons Employment, 1965; Communications Officer Course, 1966; Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Operations Course, 1966; Educational Administration, MS, Utah State University, 1971; Educational Development, Ed D, Utah State University; 1973; command and General Staff (Resident/Nonresident), 1976; Corps Artillery Field Artillery Staff Officer Refresher, 1976; Self-propelled Field Artillery Battalion Staff Refresher, 1978; NATO Orientation Training, 1978; Nuclear Chemical Target Analyst refresher, 1974, 1979, 1986; field Artillery Staff Refresher, 1980; Nuclear Chemical Target Analyst Refresher, 1982; NATO Training Pacific, 1984; Brigadier General Orientation Course, 1985.

General Miller was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Field Artillery on 29 October 1959 and was assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Battery 2d Battalion, 222d Field Artillery as Communications Assistant. Later having served as Recon and Survey Officer and Executive Officer he became the Headquarters and Headquarters Battery Commander, 2d Battalion (How) 222d Field Artillery from 1 February 1963 to 6 June 1965. After serving as Assistant S-3 in the 222d Field Artillery, he was reassigned as Assistant G-3 in Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, Utah Army National Guard on 1 November 1971. During the period 1 July 1972 to 24 July 1973, he served as Fire Support Element Team Chief at XI Corps Artillery, S-3 at Headquarters and Headquarters Battery 1st Battalion 145th Field Artillery, and Assistant S-3 for XI Corps Artillery before returning to the 2d Battalion 222d Field Artillery as the S-3. He was assigned as Battalion Executive Officer, 2d Battalion, 222d Field Artillery on 19 August 1974; assumed command of the battalion on 28 April 1975 and served in that assignment until July 1978 when he was transferred to XI Corps Artillery as the S-2. He was appointed Executive Officer, XI Corps Artillery and promoted to Colonel on 1 December 1978. On 1 February 1981, he was appointed Deputy Commander, XI Corps Artillery and served until 23 August 1983, at which time he became the Commander of XI Corps Artillery, was promoted to Brigadier General, and was federally recognized as Brigadier General of the line. In June 1984, XI Corps Artillery was redesignated I Corps Artillery. On 17 August 1989, General Miller was promoted to Major General. General Miller's current assignment is HQ TRADOC, Deputy Commanding General-ARNG.
