James Bulger (Jimmy) Mool was the only son of Harry William Mool and Josephine Colvin Bulger Mool. He graduated from Ponce de Leon High School in Miami, Florida and received a B.A. from the University of Miami and a M.A. from Duke University. His master's thesis was titled, "Florida in Federal Politics: Statehood to Secession." He taught social studies in South Miami schools and continued to work toward a PH.D degree until he joined the army in October of 1942.

July 1944 - James B. Mool married Juanita (Nita) Hope Stern. Three months later he was sent overseas.

He died as a result of drowning in the European area. He died 2 days before V-E day when the jeep he was driving crossed a bridge which collapsed.

Jimmy Mool was a member of Kappa Sigma Fraternity, the Florida Historical Association and a Mason. James Mool had no children.
