

Colonel Frederic G. Mumma, Artillery OCS Class 65-43

His military career spanned more than 30 years. He first entered military service in 1941 as an Army bandsman. He was commissioned a second lieutenant, artillery in on May 20, 1943. He and served as an artillery instructor at the Artillery Officer Candidate School, Fort Sill, Oklahoma and Camp Roberts California and later in China during World War II. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

Colonel Mumma served with the 32nd Infantry Division at Fort Lewis, Washington, during the Berlin Crisis of 1961-62. He commanded the 1st Battalion, 632nd Armor and was promoted to Colonel on September 15, 1969. He was Deputy Chief of Staff for Headquarters, Wisconsin Army National Guard from September 1969 to April 1971. On September 1, 1972 he was named Commandant of the Wisconsin Military Academy. The school was organized in 1958.
