LTC Newman lost his life during a second tour in Vietnam. During 1965-66 he was a Rotary Wing Aviator with the 110th Aviation Company (Aerial Weapons), which later became Company D, 229th Aviation Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division. Colonel Newman's second tour was spent with the 315th Aviation Company, first as a Detachment Commander and later as the Company Commander. He was a Senior Army Aviator with 16 years of service and more than 3400 flight hours when the OV-1 (Mohawk) he was piloting crashed in Thua Thien Province. He had served more than 11 1/2 months of his second tour at the time of his death.
