- 1. Contemporary Candidate's classmate
- 2. Corcoran Bites Sores on ankles from Corcoran or jump boots.
- 3. Drop The order for pushups
- 4. <u>Dud</u> Candidate whose appearance and bearing fall way below OCS standards
- 5. Gig Deficiency in inspection
- 6. Golf Suit Pants and shirt of fatigues that don't match
- 7. Greenbird A candidate with middleclass status
- 8. Greatto Extra food you bring to your husband.
- 9. House The plateen building where your husband lives
- 10. Jark 4.2 mile job to MB-4
- 11. Magic Work or study done by a candidate after hours
- 12. MB-4 The jark hill's pot name
- 13. Nuc To completely disarrange articles of a candidate's gear which do not meet acceptable standards. The aftermath of such a "nuclear attack" by a TAC officer or an upperclassman.
- 14. PT's Uniforms used for physical training
- 15. Redbird A candidate with upporclass status
- 16. S.O.P. Standard operating procedures
- 17. Smack Lower classman, with color of blue
- 18. Strac (Adj.) Above the standards required in GCS; usually describes the outstanding appearance of a candidate or his gear.
- 19. "Sweat" Position NCO or officer position assigned to a candidate to help him learn different levels of responsibility.

 The candidate's performance is graded and these grades serve as the basis for his leadership average

- 20. TAC Staff The officers and NCO's who operate the OC Batallion
- 21. Turnback When a candidate has been absent because of illness, or emergency leave, or has had difficulty with academics or leadership, he may be considered a turnback to another class. This action is considered a second chance for the deserving and promising candidate.
- 22. White Stripe Refers to the white stripe on the felt tab of those candidates who rank in the top 12 1/2 per cent of their class. These men are on the Commandant's List and are accorded special privileges.
