

Colonel Gregory Pritchett Class 7-69

Colonel Pritchett's initial assignment was Section Leader and then Team Commander, 74th USA Artillery Detachment, 512th Artillery Group, U.S. Army Europe. He then completed a tour in Vietnam with HHB, 5th Battalion, 42nd Artillery, 23rd Artillery Group as an Assistant S-3.

He left active duty and continued his military career with the U.S. Army Reserve. His initial Reserve assignment was to the 375th Field Depot, Montgomery Alabama. After a branch transfer to the Medical Service Corp, he transferred to the 129th Mobile Army Surgical Hospital (MASH) as Medical Supply Officer. After the 129th was deactivated, he served in the 1207th United States Army Hospital (100 Bed) in successive positions as Health Service Personnel Officer, Detachment Commander and Executive Officer. He was ordered to active duty in support of Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm and served as Administrative Officer, Family Practice, Clinical Support Division, Martin Army Community Hospital, Fort Benning. In 1993 he was invited to attend the Reserve Component National Security Course for senior Reserve component members, allied officers and select interagency civilian and industry fellows working in national security.

As an Associate Chemist at Southern Research Institute, Birmingham Alabama, Colonel Pritchett conducted research on several projects funded by the U.S. Army Institute of Dental Research. One project focused on preparing decontamination solutions to apply to soldier's clothing and equipment for field use. He was Chair, Department of Chemistry at Tuskegee University and retired in 2014 as Associate Dean, College of Arts and Sciences, Tuskegee University. His military decorations include the Bronze Star.
