


Edward W. Ross

Mr. Ross was appointed Director, Security Assistance Operations, Defense Security Assistance Agency on June 1, 1994. From January 1993 to May 1994, Mr. Ross served concurrently as Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for POW/MIA Affairs and Acting Director, Defense POW/MIA Office (DPMO). From June 1992 to January 1993 he served as Director, Office of POW/MIA Affairs, Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense, International Security Affairs. Mr. Ross was awarded the Secretary of Defense Medal for Meritorious Civilian Service in June 1992 and June 1994.



From January 1984 to May 1992, Mr. Ross served as Senior Country Director for China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and Mongolia, Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense, International Security Affairs. In this capacity, he published numerous articles concerning U.S.-China military relations and was a recognized authority on Chinese affairs.

As the Assistant U.S. Army Attache to the People's Republic of China from 1983 to 1984, Mr. Ross played a key role in the opening of the U.S.-China military relationship. Mr. Ross retired from the U.S. Army after twenty years service on August 20, 1984. His military awards include: the Silver Star, the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Bronze Star, the Air Medal with "V" Device with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Army Commendation Medal, and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.

Mr. Ross's other military assignments include service as a senior political-military analyst in the Directorate for Estimates, Defense Intelligence Agency from 1979 to 1983, where he drafted and coordinated Defense and National Intelligence Estimates on China, the

Soviet Union, and Taiwan. He became a U.S. Army Foreign Area Officer after two years intense Chinese language and area studies in Taiwan from 1976 to 1978. As a Military Intelligence Officer, from 1973 to 1975 he served as the Chief, Counterespionage-Counterintelligence, Headquarters, 500th Military Intelligence Group, Hawaii, with responsibility for operations in the Pacific theater. From 1970 to 1971, he commanded an intelligence collection detachment of the 525th Military Intelligence Group in Vietnam. Commissioned a second lieutenant in the Artillery on June 14, 1966, from 1966 to 1967, he served as an artillery forward and air observer with the 9th Infantry Division in Vietnam, flying more than 300 combat and combat support missions in O-1 and H-23 aircraft.

Mr. Ross received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science from Quincy College, Quincy, Illinois, in 1973. He received his Master of Arts Degree in National Security Affairs from the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, in 1979. Mr. Ross is a graduate of the Defense Language Institute, Washington, D.C., the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas, and the American Embassy School for Chinese Language and Area Studies, Taichung, Taiwan. Mr. Ross has completed extensive postgraduate work toward a Ph.D. in Political Science, specializing in international relations and United States domestic politics, at The George Washington University, Washington, D.C. He has travelled extensively through-out Asia and is both fluent and literate in Chinese.
