## Hyrum W. Smith (Class 1-67)

Hyrum W. Smith was commissioned an Artillery Officer upon graduation from Officer Candidate School Class 1-67 (Fort Sill), 17 December 1966. His first duty assignment was as a Platoon Leader with Battery A, 4th Battalion, 41st Artillery, Schwäbisch Gmünd, Germany.

His subsequent duty assignments include Commander, Headquarters Battery, 56th Artillery Group, Germany. His military education includes the Pershing Missile Officer Course and Preventive Maintenance Course.

His military awards include the Good Conduct Medal and the National Defense Service Medal.

Hyrum's civilian service includes: The Department of the Army's Outstanding Civilian Service Medal, Co-founder of The Galileo Initiative, Founder of the Franklin Quest Company, and creator of the Franklin Planner. He has been inducted into the Honorable Order of St. Barbara and is a Distinguished Member of the Army OCS Hall of Fame, financed the Tuacahn non-profit arts and education center, and served as President of the Board of Trustees for the Command and General Staff College Foundation. Under his leadership at the Command and General Staff College Foundation, the size of the endowment was dramatically increased.
