FSB Currahee, A Shau Valley

1LT Eddie Smith was visiting the FDC of B 2/11th FA, 101st Airborne co-located with his unit, A 2/319th FA on FSB Currahee. FSB Currahee was established 9 MAY 69 to support the assault on nearby Dong Ap Bia (Hamburger Hill). The FSB was attacked by NVA around dusk on 9 JUNE 69. The action lasted until the next morning. 1LT Smith was mortally wounded in the intial enemy preperation fires by a 60mm mortar round that landed in the entrance to the FDC. Several others in the FDC were also wounded by the same round, including me. I was the XO of B 2/11 FA. Although I only knew Eddie in passing, I think about him frequently. A personable, nice fellow who was a professional artilleryman. He had spent many months prior to his death in the field working with the infantry as a Forward Observer and had just been reassigned to work in his firing battery. God bless him and his family.
