

Colonel Alfred G. Snelgrove Class 3B-68

Colonel Snelgrove served with the U.S. Army Artillery Board at Fort Sill prior to attending the Rotary Wing Aviator Course at Fort Walters, Texas. He then served a tour in Vietnam with B Battery, 2nd Battalion, 20th Aerial Rocket Artillery. At Fort Rucker, Alabama, he was assigned to the U.S. Army Aviation School as an Artillery Instructor and later Personnel Services Officer.

He was Survey Officer, Division Artillery S-2 and HHB Commander, 2nd Armored Division Artillery at Fort Hood and then served as Commander of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization Observer Group Sinai-Jerusalem. At Fort Lewis, Washington he served as the S-1, 3rd Squadron, 5th Cavalry, 9th Infantry Division. He then commanded the 116th Aviation Company, 10th Aviation Battalion and later served as the Battalion S-3.

Colonel Snelgrove was later assigned to the Military Personnel Center in Alexandria, Virginia, where he served successive assignments as Professional Development Officer; Aviation Assignments Officer; Aviation Branch Chief; and OPMD Executive Officer. After serving as Assistant G-3, I Corps at Fort Lewis, he assumed command of the 9th Aviation Battalion, 9th Cavalry Brigade. He then commanded the 10th Aviation Brigade, 10th Mountain Division at Fort Drum and culminated his career as Director of Leadership Studies at the Army War College.

His decorations include the Legion of Merit with Oak-Leaf Cluster, the Bronze Star with Oak-Leaf Cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal with Two Oak-Leaf Clusters and 22 awards of the Air Medal.
