One of the earliest Combat Forward Observers in the US Army (Dec 42); called for the concentration that earned the 8th FA Bn the name of "Automatic Eighth" (Guadalcanal-Hill 81); claims longest continuous officer service in the 101st Abn Div (40 months); named 19th FA the "Black Horse Batteries" in Korea; while 101 Abn Div Arty CO was charged with confirmatory type II test of M102 howitzer for Artillery Board and influenced its adoption as standard howitzer for airborne and airmobile FA Bns. Has made 119 military and free fall parachute jumps.
