BIOGRAPHY (13 July 1977)

Colonel George E. Thayer, Jr.

Born and reared in Norfolk, Virginia, Colonel George E. Thayer, Jr. also began his military career there as an enlisted man in the Air Corps Reserve. Called to active duty in 1946, he completed Officer Candidate School and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant of Field Artillery in Oct 1946. Upon completion of Flight School at San Marcos, Texas, he went on to Ft Sill, Oklahoma.

In 1948, Colonel Thayer served with the 7th Infantry Division in Korea and was aide-de-camp to the assistant division commander, BG E. W. Piburn, in Japan. During the Korean War, he flew as a Liaison Pilot for the 7th Inf Div.

Assigned to the Aviation Section of the Seventh Army in 1952,

Colonel Thayer subsequently served at Headquarters, US Army, Europe. While
there, he served as personal pilot to GEN A. C. "Nuts" McAuliffe.

In 1953, Colonel Thayer was integrated into the Regular Army as an Infantry Officer.

Upon his return from overseas in 1956, Colonel Thayer attended the IOAC at Fort Benning, Georgia. Following graduation, he was assigned to Fort Rucker, Alabama where he served with the Aviation School. Later, he commanded the T-37 Test Unit.

Following another European tour, this time with the 21st Infantry, Colonel Thayer attended the Command and General Staff College at

Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Later, he went to the Plans and Operations
Division; Directorate of Test Support; Test, Evaluation and Control Group,
Project TEAM at Fort Benning, Ga.

Utilizing the Army's Bootstrap Program, Colonel Thayer completed his undergraduate studies in 1966. He was awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science by the University of Omaha. After graduation he was assigned to the G3 Section, USACDCEC, Fort Ord, California.

Colonel Thayer served with the 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile) in the Republic of Vietnam. He was initially assigned as the Executive Officer of the 11th Aviation Group. Later, he commanded the 227th Assault Helicopter Battalion.

When he returned from Vietnam, Colonel Thayer was assigned to

Fort Stewart, Ga. He was the Assistant Chief of Staff, G3 (later called

Directorate of Plans, Training and Security) until 19 Feb 1972, when he

was assigned as the Assistant Director of the Third US Army Test Directorate

for Test 2, OSD Reserve Component Study (more commonly known as the

Williamson Study).

In August 1973, Colonel Thayer was assigned to USARR VI at Fort Knox, Kentucky. He served as Aviation Readiness coordinator until December 1975, when he became Chief, Operations Division.

Colonel Thayer was a member of Class No. 5 of the Non-Resident Army War College, graduating in 1974.

In August 1976, Colonel Thayer was assigned to USARR V with duty station in St. Louis, Missouri, as Senior Army Advisor to the Commander, 102d US Army Reserve Command.

Colonel Thayer and his wife, Jacquetta, have four children. Virginia is married and lives in Thorntown, Indiana with her husband Ron, and their daughters Veronica, Adrianne, and Heather. George III, a 1975 Citadel graduate and DMG, is an Army Lieutenant serving in Germany. James Eric is a member of the Class of 1980 at West Point. Jody, a high school student, lives at home.
