At the time of his death, he was leading a team of Vietnamese on a mission to confirm recent Intelligence data when the team was ambushed.

Captain Tine was a fine officer and gentleman. I was his IV Corps Supervisor, over all 16 IV Corps Provinces, and CPT Tine was in charge of Intelligence Data Collection in the Province where he died. At the time of his death, he was leading a team of Vietnamese on a mission to confirm recent Intelligence data when the team was ambushed. We held a memorial service for CPT Tine two days later in the Province Town where he was stationed. CPT Tine was proficient in his duties and well liked by all who knew him. He always stood out to me because he was a tall man, and next to the short Vietnamese defenders he worked with, he seemed like a giant. Of all of my 16 Province subordinates, CPT Tine was among the top rated officers. I had the honor to visit his name on the Vietnam Memorial years later. CPT Tine will never be forgotten by me. I have always wished I could have met his family, but I never had the opportunity to find them. I am pleased that at last I can provide this small memento of CPT Tine's war-time service performance.
